Description:





Description:

Being unique is part of standing out in the future of typography. This typeface does just that and features very custom qualities. It has sharper points and lines in its slab serifs, arms and crossbars. This only comes in one font style, regular, so it does not lend itself well outside of larger headlines, phrases and names. This typeface does a good job at setting itself apart from others, giving you a unique twist to your headlines or logos.

Practical Application



All characters in this typeface are uppercase but each character comes in two different looks.


Try typing one character with lowercase and then uppercase and combine the characters you like the best. For instance, I like this version of the E with the slant better than the second version.



Feel free to use warp and envelope distort to add curves to this typeface. It has a very chunky quality to it which allows you to bend and curve it while maintaining readablity.



Don't forget about numbers. Sometimes when creating infographics or designs using larger numbers we need to find a bold unique number set.



Description:

This typeface features a lot of contrast in the stroke throughout the letters and this one exaggerates just about everything. It includes the use of curvy tails that are great for overlapping to create a calligraphy style effect.

The uppercase here is a little tough to use but try experimenting with the lowercase characters.



Practical Application



The tails on this typeface make it special. Try overlapping the tails to make the words feel more together and united.

I also paired this with LUST for the "and the" words to tone the smaller words down. This typeface works best when used in small doses.



Super illustrative, this typeface works great for t-shirts and other wearable content.



Balance out your ascenders
(the stuff that extends out the top)
and your descenders (the stuff that
extends down below your average
baseline).

This makes sure your letters do not look too heavy to the top, bottom, left or right.

A luxurious typeface that features consistent wavy features throughout its characters. Like a lot of detailed typefaces featured in this document, it is best to use this sparingly as a display headline font or logo and not to overwhelm the design with too much typographic details.

It has a feminine but playful quality and makes a bold statement with its daring curves.


High-end brands may benefit from a smooth expressive typeface like this. The characters are a design unto themselves, so pair this with a simple photo for some stunning results.

Damn is a contemporary geometric sans-serif typeface. It has extra extended characters and is very condensed. You can pack a lot of letters in a narrow space.

It has almost a grotesque-like appearance with nonparallel arms and legs with slightly various widths. Those characteristics give it a little bit of "different" and "interesting". Best used for a modern boundarypushing brand.

Practical Application
