Description

If you listen to a lecture and still do not understand, there are other video course lectures you can watch for more explanation and examples.

The expectation is that you are already very familiar with the IELTS, have been successful, and need that added push to fill in the gaps you are missing. Please keep in mind that you are responsible and accept the realities of taking an accelerated version of the course.
